No program policy changes affecting student progression or requirements for program completion will be implemented for students enrolled in the program. Students follow the policies as written in the Student Handbook for the cohort for which they are enrolled.

ADN/PN Progression/Completion Policy

To be admitted and progress in the nursing program, a student must:

- Be selected for program admission by the Nursing Selection Committee or Program Administrator as determined by policy in the Washington State College of Ohio Catalog and this Handbook;
- Comply with college policies on academic standing and graduation requirements;
- Furnish evidence of having met all specific health and legal requirements prior to attending any clinical courses as outlined in this handbook - fully completed Health Examination by Physician form, or other health exam form utilized by the student's primary care practitioner, immunizations, background check, negative drug screen, and current CPR certification or any additional requirements as deemed necessary by our clinical agencies. Refer to the guidelines in Section G, Requirements Prior to Clinical;
- Maintain professional liability insurance (provided by the College);
- Earn at least a "B" in each nursing theory course and "satisfactory" in each clinical course;
- Maintain a satisfactory evaluation for clinical/lab in all nursing courses. An unsatisfactory clinical grade will result in an automatic "C" in the course;
- Earn at least a "C" in all non-nursing courses by the beginning of the term immediately following the semester in which the course is listed on the Nursing Program audit sheet.
- Maintain the sequence of courses as listed in the nursing program. General education courses may be taken in sequence prior to starting the nursing program.
- Complete the ADN program from the initial start date, within a total of three (3) years by traditional/generic students, and two (2) years by advanced placement/bridge students; two years for Practical Nursing students.



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- If a student is unsuccessful (or withdraws) and cannot continue in the program, it is the student's responsibility to drop any nursing courses in which they have preregistered for the upcoming semester.
- Any student receiving an incomplete in any course is required to meet with the Program Administrator to discuss course requirements for completion.
