ACADEMIC & MILITARY HONORS

Some degrees are awarded with special recognition. For those who have achieved appropriate standards in their work, the words cum laude (with honors), magna cum laude (with high honors), and summa cum laude (with highest honors) are used. These achievements are recorded on the diplomas. Students receiving one of these honors are recognized by wearing a white cord over their academic gown. Members of Phi Theta Kappa, the honorary society for two-year colleges are noted on diplomas and transcripts. These students are recognized at Washington State Community College by wearing a gold stole over their academic gown and a gold tassel instead of the standard white. Red, white and blue honor cords are awarded to all veterans who have served honorably in the armed forces of the United States. These honor cords signify the appreciation Washington State Community College has for the service and sacrifice our student Veterans have made for our country.

PINNING TRADITIONS

The Nursing Pin Tradition

The actual symbolism of the pin relates to a custom established in the 16th century when the privilege of wearing a coat of arms was limited to noblemen who served their kings with distinction. As centuries passed, the privilege was extended to schools and craft guilds, and the symbols of wisdom, strength, courage, and faith appeared on buttons, badges, and shields. It was probably this concept that Florence Nightingale was capturing when she chose the Maltese cross as a symbol when selecting a badge for the graduates of her first nursing school.

As nursing developed as a profession, each school chose a unique and different pin awarded upon completion of the program, and as a symbol to the public of work well done. Many of the early schools, particularly those associated with hospitals supported by religious groups, have incorporated the cross into their pin. Upon graduation from the program, a "pinning" ceremony would be held and new graduates would be awarded their nursing pin. ~Ellis & Hartley, 2012
