ACADEMIC REGALIA

The ceremonies of commencement remind us of the history of colleges and universities. The degrees and the regalia associated with them come to us from medieval European universities. The origins of academic dress date back to the 12th and 13th centuries, when universities were taking form. The ordinary dress of the scholar, whether student or teacher, was the dress of a cleric. With few exceptions, the medieval scholar had taken at least minor orders, made certain vows, and perhaps been tonsured. Long gowns were worn and may have been necessary for warmth in unheated buildings. Hoods seem to have served to cover the tonsured head until superseded for that purpose by the skull cap.

From medieval practice, academic dress has three items: cap, gown, and hood. In reviving the use of these items for the United States, an intercollegiate commission in 1895 drafted a code that most colleges follow. Those receiving an Associate degree wear a colored gown identifying the school colors. For all degrees, the mortarboard is the traditional cap. The familiar "mortar board" with a tassel hanging to the left side is appropriate for all degrees.

Candidates for graduation wear the tassel on the right front of the cap and shift it to the left front immediately after degrees are conferred.

Washington State Community College awards associate degrees in arts or sciences, applied associate in business and science degrees, associate of individualized studies, and certificates.

HONOR'S RECOGNITION

Some degrees are awarded with special recognition. For those who have achieved appropriate standards in their work, the words cum laude (with honors), magna cum laude (with high honors), and summa cum laude (with highest honors) are used. Cum laude honors are recognized for students who have a GPA between 3.75-3.89. Magna cum laude honors are recognized for students who have a GPA between 3.9 - 3.99. Summa cum laude honors are recognized for students who have a perfect 4.0.

These achievements are recorded on the diplomas. Students receiving one of these honors are recognized by wearing a white cord over their academic gown. Members of Phi Theta Kappa, the honorary society for two-year colleges are noted on diplomas and transcripts. These students are recognized at Washington State Community College by wearing a gold stole over their academic gown and a gold tassel instead of the standard white. Red, white and blue honor cords are awarded to all veterans who have served honorably in the armed forces of the United States. These honor cords signify the appreciation Washington State Community College has for the service and sacrifice our student Veterans have made for our country.
